IPLÉ'S ANTI-CHEATING POLICY

At IPLÉ, cheating (including through AI tools) is considered a serious offence, punishable with significant sanctions.

How cheating will be treated



If you're caught cheating during the exam, you'll fail it.

The instructor may notify the IPLE coordinator.



For written exams, software to detect AI use and plagiarism is employed. As a result, you may be asked to take an oral exam to confirm your mark.

If evidence of AI use or plagiarism is confirmed, you'll fail the exam. The instructor shall notify the IPLE coordinator. The instructor may adopt additional ad-hoc measures to prevent cheating.



In the case of multiple and severe notifications, you will be summoned by the IPLE coordinator.

The IPLE coordinator may decide to refer the case to the University Disciplinary Proceedings Office.

Penalties include suspension and expulsion from the university.
